The annual SAIL Conference of IAMSLIC was held at Marine Institute, Memorial University of Newfoundland from May 13-16, 2014. Dorothy has worked in a variety of jobs during her checkered career, and in addition to her MSLIS has an old master's degree in Classics and one from 2002 in Natural History from the State University of New York.

Angela Clark-Hughes is the Librarian Associate Professor at the Rosenstiel School of Marine & Atmospheric Science at the University of Miami. Angela holds a BS in Psychology from Georgia State University, and a Master of Library and Information Science from Simmons College in Boston. In addition to her membership in IAMSLIC and SAIL, Angela is also a member of Society of American Archivists (SAA).

Cyr Couturier completed his graduate studies in Marine Biology from Dalhousie University in 1986. He is currently Chair of aquaculture programs at Memorial University and is also a research scientist with the aquaculture section of the Marine Institute of Memorial University.
