Instructions for Proceedings Authors

Submission Timeline:

Please send your completed manuscript to Dorothy Barr (<u>dbarr@oeb.harvard.edu</u>), Editor of the *Proceedings*, by **December 20, 2017** in order for it to be included.

Paper Layout:

Title Author(s) Addresses(es) of Author(s) Abstract (100-300 words) – one paragraph *only* Keywords: Please add 5-10 keywords that best indicate the content of the paper. If possible, use keywords from a recognized authority list, such as the Aquatic Sciences and Fisheries Thesaurus (ASFA), or Library of Congress Subject Headings Body of Paper References: <u>APA style</u>. If you use reference management software, please remove any formatting

Submission Format:

Papers should be sent as email attachments. The preferred format is Word, but most standard word processor formats are acceptable (not PDFs). All papers will be reformatted in the same format (Ariel) and font (11 point), with 1" margins. PowerPoint or other slide presentations will **not** be accepted.

Notes:

- Please do not break your paper into sections.
- Images and tables must fit within the margins or they may not be used. It is best if tables are built within Word.
- Please don't wrap text around images or tables as that may cause problems in the final version.

References (<u>APA Style</u>):

Citations in the text:

To cite the work when you don't name the author in the text: (Smith, 1984); (Smith and Jones, 1984); three, four or five authors: list them, separate by commas, join last two with and: (Smith, Jones, Pond and Song, 1984); more than five authors = (Smith et al., 1984).

If you do mention the author in the text: Smith (1982); Smith (1982a, b); Smith (1983, 1984); Smith & Jones (1984); three, four or five authors: list them, separate by commas, join last two with &: Smith, Jones, Pond & Song (1984); more than five authors = Smith et al. (1984).

At the end of the paper list your **References**, again in APA 6th format. Examples:

Bugnyar, T. (2008). Animal cognition: Rooks team up to solve a problem. *Current Biology, 18*(12), R532.
